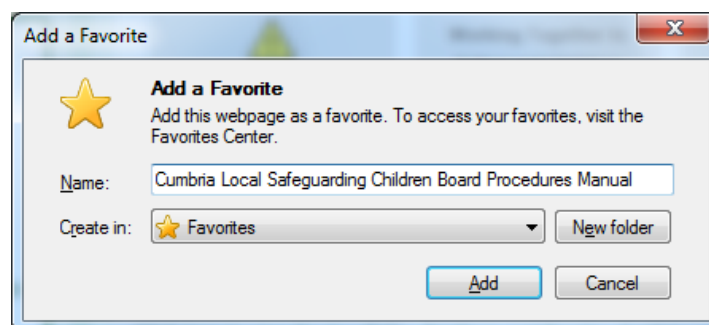

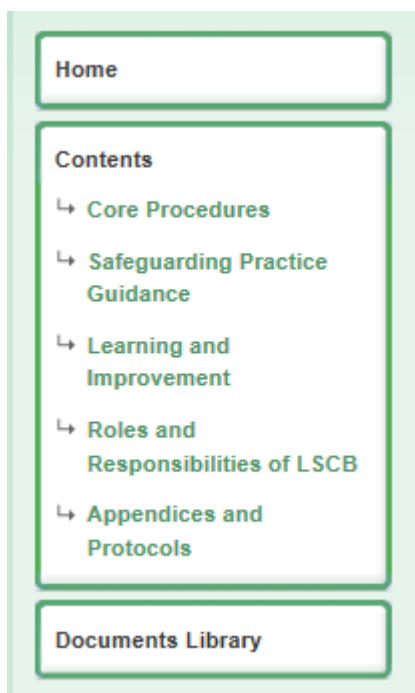

Finding procedures from the menu



Procedures are divided amongst four categories:

Core Procedures (what to do) e.g. Thresholds, Child Protection, Allegations Against Staff or Volunteers etc

Safeguarding guides (safeguarding children practice guidance) e.g. Bullying, Domestic Abuse, Child Sexual Exploitation etc

Learning and Improvement (Learning and Improvement Strategy, Serious Case Reviews, CDOP etc)

Roles and Responsibilities of LSCB (inc. Conflict Resolution Policy and Guidance for Safe Recruitment etc)

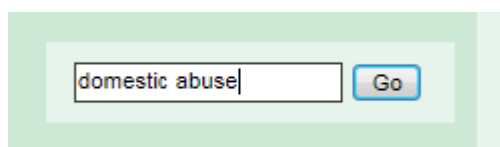
Additional tools and protocols can be found in:

Appendices and Protocols (inc. Local Protocol for Assessment)

Documents Library (tools for professionals, checklists, forms and flowcharts) e.g. Body Map, CSE Risk Indicators and Tool, The Graded Care Profile (from Neglect Guidance).

Finding procedures using the search


Enter clear terms like 'domestic abuse', 'LADO' and 'sexual exploitation' to find relevant procedures.

The guidance describes the overarching approach taken in Cumbria to supporting children (pre-birth up to 18 years) and their families and then explains the different elements of the approach in more detail.
